Mid-year Meeting 2007

Final version (11 November 2007)

**Held at the showground, Brugelette, Belgium
Friday July 20**

This record of the meeting is compiled from notes taken by Keith Martin during the meeting.

Meeting opened : 18:00

The meeting was informal, with no binding decisions taken. It was an opportunity, with so many International Representatives present, to discuss several matters in general terms.

Introduction

The Chairman welcomed Italy as a new member (see also below), represented by Jacques Cavé, and new representatives Sophie van de Calseyde (Belgium), and Nick Maher (Ireland) who was not present at the meeting.

Points introduced by the Chairman

Competition Guidelines

It has been discussed very often at IMGA meetings, but so far there has been no significant progress on establishing guidelines for organising major international competitions. Being on-site at such a competition seemed to be the ideal time to re-visit this subject, and several proposals were made for the best way to move forward.

It was agreed that Anne Devitt (former International Representative for Ireland) would prepare a questionnaire to send to all members to get their input on the structure and content of a guidelines document.

An outline could then be presented at the AGM in November, and if approved, the complete document could be available during 2008.

In particular, the input of those countries which have recently organised a World Championship or other major competition would be of particular value.

Code of Conduct

The current status of the Code of Conduct document is "provisionally approved".

It remains to ensure its implementation by reaching agreement on two main points :

1. IMGGA has to set up a Disciplinary Committee. This should be done at the November AGM, but members are requested to think about the structure of the committee, how many members, etc.
2. Each member country has to ensure that their members are in some way bound by IMGGA's Code of Conduct. This could be done on a competition-by-competition basis, or as a part of the membership requirements, but all members are requested to ensure that this is done at the national level.

Alcohol Controls

The Chairman confirmed that the use of a breathalyser at the current competition was a positive step towards controlling abuse of alcohol and re-enforcing IMGGA's commitment to health and safety.

The current use was based on a regulation drawn up by MGAGB, but for application at an international level it would need to be reviewed and modified. In particular, cultural differences would need to be considered, the limit to be applied would have to be decided, and the scope of who is tested could be extended to all those involved in the games, not just riders.

These questions will be addressed at the November AGM.

IMGGA Accounts

The Chairman informed all members that the accounts had been prepared as usual, in accordance with all legal requirements, and were ready for submission to Companies House and the taxation authorities.

Trophies

All members were asked to return the trophies from 2006 for re-presentation. An effort would be made to record the inscriptions on the trophies, plus the plaques of previous winners, and to publish this information, with photos, on the IMGGA website.

DEFRA

The Chairman announced that an agreement has been reached with DEFRA (Department for Environment, Food, and Rural Affairs - the UK government department responsible for import/export control of ponies) which will make the export of ponies from the UK easier and cheaper.

Details will follow.

Budget

Last year it was agreed that the official responsible for Administration and Finance should construct a budget each year for the forthcoming year. Jens Martin asked all members to provide input for the 2008 budget.

New Member - Italy

Jim Dunn reported on the latest new member of IMGA : Italy.

Negotiations had been difficult for several reasons, amongst them difficulties of communication, but everything had been successfully concluded just a few days before the World Championship. The Belgian organisers had made a great effort to include an additional team at such a late stage.

Jacques Cavé spoke about the evolution of Mounted Games in Italy and thanked everyone for their welcome.

This announcement, and this record of it, constitute an official notification to all members that Italy is now a member of IMGA.

Points from Members

Annual IMGA meeting November 2007

Last year it was agreed that the 2007 meeting would take place in Florida, and so Jim Dunn and Paul Greiling made a short presentation of the arrangements already made. Details are attached in Annex 1.

World Championship 2008

Phil Logue made a short presentation of the arrangements for 2008. Details are attached in Annex 2, and the website <http://www.wmg08.com.au> is already available.

Age groups for International Competitions

On behalf of MGA England, Keith Hardy presented some ideas for the 2009 World Championship. It was suggested that the competition could be split into age groups in the same way as the European Championship, and that this would require some discussion and agreement on the exact age groups to be used.

There was some discussion on whether the concept was valid, and it was left to members to think about it and return to the subject in November.

Criteria for membership

Norway asked about progress on the setting of criteria for membership (point 10 and decision 11/06 in the minutes of the November 2006 meeting).

Jim Dunn replied that the first draft was ready.

European pool of ponies

Clive Jones proposed a scheme for creating a pool of ponies in Europe, for the use of visiting teams.

While it was generally agreed that the idea was sound, several practical questions were raised concerning the administration and financing of the idea. The subject will be raised again in November.

Census

On behalf of Colin Carson (who had to leave the meeting early), Jim Dunn proposed that IMGA should carry out a "census" of the national MGAs. It would be useful to know just how big Mounted Games has become world-wide. How many members? How many riding members ? How many competitions are held annually ? etc.

The subject will be raised again in November.

The meeting was closed at 19:15

ACE TOURS and BUSES

Ace tours have quoted me a rate of a short bus to pick up in Tampa/St Pete and drive the group to the Florida Everglades for 1150.00. This bus will hold a max of 32 passengers but does not have a restroom on board. They have quoted me a rate of 42.00 pp for the Florida Everglades tours in addition to the cost of the bus. Based of 30 passengers the bus would be 38.00 pp and then the tour would be 42.00 for a total of 80.00 pp. The regular rate for the tour is 55.00 not including the bus; however it may be better to just book the tour as most of the IMGA members may have already rented cars.

Ace tours also have a 55 passenger bus that has a restroom on board that is available for 1400.00 for the day from St Pete to the Everglades and back. This would be the most cost effective if we have a lot of people that want to take the tour. We would still receive the 42.00 pp rate for the tour of the everglades. Again it just depends on the number of people that want to take the tour.

DISNEY THEME PARKS

The rates for the theme parks pass are as follows:

1 day : \$67/day 2 day : \$66/day 3 day : \$64/day 4 day : \$50/day

However usually if they book a Disney Package including the hotels they would get a better rate on the passes.

Disney hotels start at 82.00 per night and would include transfers from the Orlando airport to the hotel but do not include the theme park passes.

Again depending on the number of people that would want to do this option we would be able to get a group discount but until I know the number Disney won't advise me of the discount. I would book all of these tours as NET and not charge a commission so that the cost would be lower.

Rental Cars picking up in Orlando

Compact rental cars are available for rent starting at 19.00 per day with pick up and drop off in Orlando.
