THE CHAIRMAN'S WORD

The first newsletter of 2016, so let's look forward to what is planned for this year.

July will be a very busy month with the World Team Championship in Ireland, and the European Championship in Germany. Then in August we'll have the World Pairs Championship in Denmark, and the World Individual Championship in Wales. A lot of people are working very hard to ensure the success of these championships.

Because these championships are close together in time, but far apart in distance, it's important that the welfare of the participating ponies is taken very seriously.

In the past, in similar circumstances, the number of ponies "tying up" has been much higher than when the championships are more evenly spread out. So take precautions for the sake of your ponies and their ability to carry you successfully through a competition.

Make sure they're fit for the season and do your homework on how to prevent "tying up". Be aware that they won't be ready to compete at World Championship level only 10 minutes after unloading from a three day journey. Take it steady, and bring them back gently into top condition.

Look after them well and give them the care and attention they need, and I wish you and them success during 2016.

There's one big change in IMGA policy this year which I'm sure will be appreciated. The 2016 edition of the official Rule Book is now available to consult and/or download on the IMGA website (www.mounted-games.org), and there's no charge. More than 500 downloads have already been recorded, but for those people who prefer to have the usual printed book tucked safely into a back pocket, that will also soon be available for sale as usual.

THE INTERVIEW

FABIAN PIGEOLET

For this first interview of 2016, we have decided to ask a few questions to a Belgian referee and competition organisor: Fabian Pigeolet.

Hi Fabian! Thank you for accepting this interview. Could you tell us when and how you discovered Mounted Games?

Hi Sean, thank you for thinking of me for this interview. I discovered Mounted Games 9 years ago, I was looking for a riding school for my daughter Morgane and we landed at the Buisseret Pony Club. There was a Mounted Games demonstration that day and my daughter told me: that's what I want to do! In September 2007, she started playing games and I discovered this sport, in the first place as a parent, then as arena party and finally in 2008, we attended the European Championships in Verden (Germany).

Your family and you have this passion in common. What do you like in this sport?

First of all, unlike what we thought about horse riding, it's a team sport even though our children like pairs and individuals. We really enjoy meeting people and the many exchanges during national and international competitions. You still have fair play in competitions. It's a passion that we share as a family, each one of us has its own role in our little organisation (laugh)

You're now a recognised international referee, how did you get there?

After 3 years at competitions, I wanted to get involved in refereeing. Firstly, as an assistant referee, for about 3 years. Then I passed my national referee certification in Belgium (2012). Finally, I did my IMGA referee certification in 2013. My first invitation to referee came from abroad, for the Grand Ouest International Challenge in Corné (France), followed by La Bonde (France). In 2014, I got the chance to referee the World Team Championships in La Bonde and the World Pairs. In 2015, I refereed the Open age group at the European Championships and a few sessions at the World Individuals.

You were part of the organising team of the 2014 European Championships in Belgium with the Bepoclas committee, can you tell us more about this association? What's its role?

As you've mentioned it, I was part of the organising committee of this fantastic experience which was also a great human adventure. We managed to involve 60 volunteers every day, some of them had nothing to do, at the start, with Mounted Games.

After this event, some members of the organising committee got involved in the Bepoclas association which aims to promote Mounted Games in Belgium. As an example, the games equipment bought for the European Championships is made available freely to the different riding schools and/or riders in order for everyone to train in the best conditions with equipment in compliance with IMGA rules. During competitions, the Bepoclas association provides a commentary box with a sound system, a camera, a laptop... Always aiming to promote Mounted Games, we organise an international competition at the Ghlin Wallonie Racecourse so that Belgian riders who don't have the chance to ride abroad can discover another aspect of the discipline. Last year, teams from 9 different countries took part in this competition.

You're an international referee, a competition organisor, a parent of riders... Which means that you attend a lot of competitions: what are your goals for 2016?

As always, my daughters and I have many goals: the Grand Ouest International Challenge, The Grand Tournoi (French Championships), the World Pairs for my daughter Laurine and Rosie Wheeler (English rider), the British Pairs for my daughter Morgane and Quentin Castel (Belgian rider), the organisation of the Bepoclas competition in Ghlin on October, 22nd & 23rd with, I hope, many nations attending. A last wish, let's be mad: becoming national trainer one day!

What have been your best 3 moments in Mounted Games?

The European Championships 2014 (2 years of work), Laurine's bronze medal at the U12 Individual Masters (we had been training for 6 months) and Morgane's two World Pairs semifinals (U12 in 2010 and U 17 in 2013).

But my best memory has to be when I was training my two daughters playing together at the Belgian Triagames Pairs Challenge in 2015, they got the bronze medal in the U17 age group.

When you are not in a Mounted Games arena, what are your other occupations?

I train some riders, I also give refereeing courses to future referees and assistant referees for the Wallonie Bruxelles Equestrian Ligue. Other than that, I like to go to bric-a-bracs with my family.

Thank you for answering all our questions! We wish you, and your family, a successful year.
