In order to remove potential doubt there is a need to clarify when a hammer is "in" the box in the Tool Box scramble for Individuals, Pairs and Team.

If a hammer is balanced on top of the box, is it "in"? What about if it is hooked on the side?

Current Rule Book Wording:

Suggested New Rule Book Wording:

To be added to the end of the Tool Box Scramble rule for Individuals, Pairs and Team:

The hammer is considered to be in the tool box if it is in contact with the tool box and this contact is unaided by a rider or piece of equipment.

Reason for Change Request:

Adding this clarification will remove any possible doubt when a hammer is only balanced on top of the box or hooked on the side.
