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Summary of Change Requested:

Part 27 of a multi part Rule Change covering all games. Aim is to make the wording of all games consistent.

This one covers Three Pot Flag Race.

Current Rule Book Wording:

Individual (2010 rule book) :

The rider rides to the centre cone and removes a flag and then places it in either of the 2 empty cones. He/she then must continue to remove the flags singly and place them in cones so that, at the end of the race, there are 2 flags in the cone by the first pole and 2 flags in the cone by the fifth pole.

Suggested New Rule Book Wording:

Individual (proposed for 2012) :

The rider rides to the cone in the centre and collects a flag and places it in either of the other two cones. The other three flags are collected individually in the same way and placed in the other cones. The rider, then rides to cross the Start/Finish line. At the end of the game there must be two flags in each of the cones in line with poles 1 and 5.

Reason for Change Request:

Brings consistency to the wording of all games in the rule book and eliminates "grey areas".
