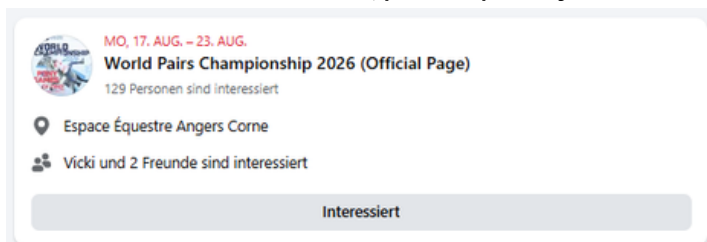
THE 2 STABLES ARE INCLUDED IN THE ENTRY FEE FOR PARTICIPANTS.

Included for each entry : 2 straw-bedded stables, access to the facilities (competition and camping) for riders and 2 supporters per rider.

Both riders also have access to 1 themed dinner, all evening parties, the Gala dinner and the Gala party.

For horses that cannot be stabled, a veterinary certificate will be required to install a paddock.

Entry is only confirmed when payment is made in full.

Option to pay in 2 instalments:

You can choose to pay the full amount, or pay only a €250 deposit to reserve your entry.

Please note: in this case, the remaining balance must be paid before May 15th.

Entries for which the balance has not been paid by 15/05 **will be forfeited and 100% non-refundable.**

For deposit cancellation requests made before May 15th, a €40 fee will be retained.

People may arrive from Monday but the competition for all will not start until Wednesday, and for the 18s & Open Individuals who finish last in Germany, they will not start until Thursday.

Tuesday is the day for training! Teams will train as their national teams all together, if your team has to arrive later on Tuesday please let us know and we can co-ordinate your training session to take place later in the day. For individual entries, the entry fee is €500 per rider. This fee includes entry to the competition, access to the venue and campsite for up to four people, including the registered rider, who remains responsible for their accompanying guests. Hay and stable with straw are included.

Electric hook-up is free if you enter before March 1st; after that date, an additional fee of €80 will apply.

For team entries, the entry fee is €2,900 per team. This covers 6 riders and access to the venue for up to ten people. Each team is responsible for its accompanying persons. Two electric hook-ups are included for all team registrations completed before March 1st.

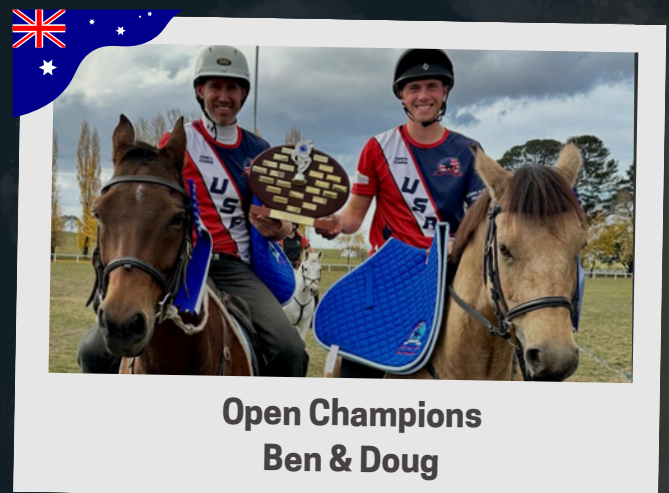

Austrian Pairs Championship at Stadl Paura

The **Stadl Paura Equestrian Centre** hosted a top-class Mounted Games weekend:

As part of the Austrian and Upper Austrian Pairs Championships, a total of 43 pairs competed.

At the same time, the tournament served as an important test event for the **World Pairs 2027**, already casting its shadow ahead.

The competitions in the U12, U15, and Open classes were firmly dominated by Upper Austria, while in the U18 category Lower Austria narrowly gained the upper hand – an exciting contest at eye level.

Throughout the weekend, spectators witnessed fast-paced races, high precision, and nearly faultless rides, highlighting the overall exceptional sporting standard.

D'où viens-tu ?

 Sud Aveyron, France

Que fais-tu dans la vie ?



-  *Je suis géomètre salarié. À côté de ça, je suis sportif de haut niveau en Mounted Games, au sein de l'équipe Red Eagle et de l'équipe de France.*
-  *I work as a surveyor, and outside of that I compete at a high level in Mounted Games with the Red Eagle team and the French national team.*

Quand et comment as-tu découvert le Mounted-Games ?



-  *J'ai découvert le Mounted Games très jeune grâce à ma mère, monitrice d'équitation, et à Jacques Cavé qui a introduit la discipline dans notre club. J'ai tout de suite aimé la vitesse, l'esprit d'équipe et le côté ludique. Après une pause pour me consacrer au concours complet et au saut d'obstacles, j'y suis revenu vers mes 20 ans avec encore plus de motivation.*
-  *I discovered MGA at a very young age thanks to my mother, a riding instructor, and Jacques Cavé, who introduced the sport to our club. I immediately loved the speed, the team spirit, and the fun side of it. After taking a break to focus on eventing and show jumping, I came back to Mounted Games in my twenties with even more motivation.*





Selon toi, quel est le meilleur aspect des Mounted-Games ?

-  *Ce que j'aime le plus dans le MG, c'est l'adrénaline, la vitesse et l'intensité. C'est aussi un sport unique par la relation avec le cheval, l'esprit d'équipe et le fair-play qu'il demande, avec une préparation aussi physique que technique.*
-  *What I love most about MGA is the adrenaline, speed, and intensity. It's also a unique sport because of the bond with the horse, the team spirit, and the sportsmanship it requires, along with both physical and technical preparation.*



Quel est ton jeu préféré ?

-  *J'apprécie particulièrement les jeux d'« à terre à cheval » comme les chaussettes, où la connexion avec le cheval et l'aspect physique sont essentiels.*
-  *I My favorite races are any vaulting races like Socks, where the connection with the horse and the physical aspect are essential.*

Dans quels pays es-tu déjà allé pour des compétitions ?


-  *Irlande, Italie, Australie, Danemark, Pays de Galles, France, Belgique, Espagne, et Angleterre*
-  *Ireland, Italy, Australia, Denmark, Wales, France, Belgium, Spain and England*


Quel est ton lieu/terrain de compétition préféré ?

-  *Mon terrain préféré reste Le Logis du Poney, notamment parce que c'est un peu le berceau de l'équipe Red Eagle. L'ambiance y est incroyable, l'accueil toujours excellent, et la qualité du terrain idéale pour notre discipline. C'est aussi là que se dérouleront les championnats du monde individuels en 2028.*
-  *My favourite venue is Le Logis du Poney, especially because it's a bit like the home base of the Red Eagle team. The atmosphere there is incredible, the welcome is always great, and the arena is perfect for our sport. It's also where the Individual World Championships will take place in 2028.*



Parle-nous de ton poney préféré de tous les temps


 Mon poney préféré est sans hésiter Enzo du Roucadou. Il est né à la maison, je l'ai vu grandir et l'ai formé de A à Z. Enzo est un poney exceptionnel : très vif, généreux, mais aussi extrêmement gentil et attachant. On a construit une vraie relation de confiance, et c'est ce qui fait toute la différence en compétition. Avec lui, j'ai remporté mes plus grands titres, dont plusieurs championnats du monde et d'Europe, et intégré l'équipe de France en 2021. Aujourd'hui, il représente tout pour moi. C'est mon cheval de tête, mon champion, et ma plus grande fierté.

 My favourite pony is without a doubt Enzo du Roucadou. He was born at home, I watched him grow up, and trained him from start to finish. Enzo is exceptional: very quick, generous, but also incredibly kind and lovable. We've built a real bond of trust, and that's what makes all the difference in competition. With him, I've won my biggest titles, including several World and European Championships, and earned my place on the French national team in 2021. He means everything to me. He's my main pony, my champion, and my greatest pride.



Anthony & Enzo

Comment te prépares-tu pour une sélection ? Quels conseils donnerais-tu à un jeune cavalier qui souhaite intégrer l'équipe nationale ?

 Pour préparer une sélection en Mounted Games, je mise avant tout sur la condition physique, pour mon poney comme pour moi. C'est essentiel pour être performant, régulier et limiter les blessures. Je m'entraîne physiquement plusieurs fois par semaine tout au long de la saison, tandis que le travail technique se fait surtout pendant la période creuse.

Pour intégrer l'équipe nationale, les qualités les plus importantes sont selon moi la régularité, la motivation et le mental. Le plus important reste de construire une vraie relation avec son poney, puis de s'entraîner sérieusement, aussi bien physiquement que techniquement, et être bien encadré par un bon coach.

- ✚ *To prepare for trials, I focus above all on physical fitness, both for my pony and myself. It's essential to perform well, stay consistent, and reduce the risk of injury. I train physically several times a week throughout the season, while the technical work is mainly done during the off-season.*

To make it onto the national team, I believe the most important qualities are consistency, motivation, and mental strength. The key is to build a real partnership with your pony, then train seriously both physically and technically, while being supported by a good coach.

Ton équipe RED-EAGLE a dominé les compétitions Française toute l'année dernière! Selon toi, qu'est-ce qui fait la force de votre équipe ?

- 🇫🇷 *Si l'équipe Red Eagle domine les compétitions françaises, c'est surtout grâce à sa cohésion et son esprit de famille. Chez nous, le collectif passe avant l'individuel, avec un vrai équilibre entre bonne ambiance et exigence en compétition. Notre force vient autant de notre niveau sportif que des valeurs que nous partageons.*
- ✚ *The Red Eagle team's success in France comes down to our team spirit and close bond. For us, the team always comes first, and we've found the right balance between enjoying ourselves and pushing each other to perform at the highest level. What really makes us strong is not just our riding ability, but also the values we share as a team.*

Quels sont tes objectifs pour cette saison ?

- 🇫🇷 *Cette saison, mes objectifs restent ambitieux, aussi bien avec l'équipe Red Eagle qu'avec l'équipe de France. Après notre titre de champions de France en paire avec Paul en avril, l'objectif est désormais de défendre nos titres européens et mondiaux avec l'équipe de France, ainsi que de viser le titre mondial en paire. L'arrivée de ma fille le 1er mai a naturellement modifié une partie du calendrier, mais la motivation reste intacte pour la suite de la saison.*
- ✚ *This season, my goals are still very ambitious, both with the Red Eagle team and the French national team. After winning the French Pairs Championship with Paul in April, the focus is now on defending our European and World titles with Team France, as well as aiming for the World Pairs title. The arrival of my daughter on May 1st has naturally changed part of the competition schedule, but the motivation for the rest of the season remains as strong as ever.*

New Composite Team Initiative for the U12 European Team Championships

IMGA is delighted to introduce a new Composite Team initiative for the Under 12 European Team Championships 2026.

This exciting development is designed to give more young riders the opportunity to experience an International Mounted Games Team Competition, particularly those from countries that may find it difficult to field a full national U12 team.

Under the new rules, eligible riders from two or more member countries can come together to form a Composite Team and take part in the Championships, helping to grow participation, friendship and international cooperation across the sport.

We hope this initiative will encourage developing nations, support emerging riders and create even more opportunities for young athletes to be part of the IMGA community.

DID YOU KNOW? NEW RULES 2026

Rule Change: Tool Box Scramble:

You no longer have to put the tool in the box before picking up the box, the new rule states: *the last hammer must be dropped into the toolbox before the rider crosses the start/finish line.*

Rule Change: Bang A Balloon (Pairs):

You no longer have to pop 2 Balloons each, the new rule states: Each rider must burst at least one balloon

New Rule: All bridles, reins & breastplate clips must be taped

GR4.4 For any tack attachments that use trigger or snap clips, the clips must be secured with tape to ensure that they cannot come undone or get caught up on anything.

RULES QUIZ

54. An assistant referee reports that a trainer led rider & pony 2 from team right into the 9m box to enable the rider to take a handover:

- a] The team is eliminated from the next race
- b] The team is eliminated
- c] The team is not eliminated

55. In Speed Weavers, a rider knocks over a pole while passing to the left of it & replaces it correctly. What side of the pole does the rider need to pass to continue the race:

- a] The rider **MUST** pass to the left of that pole
- b] The rider **MUST** pass to the right of that pole
- c] The rider **MAY** pass to either side of that pole



56. In Individual Hula Hoop, a rider goes through the tyre and finishes. The tyre rolls and lies next to the forth pole:

- a] The rider is eliminated
- b] The rider is not eliminated

57. A rider knocks over the 5th pole as she goes around it in Individual Mug Shuffle and continues to finish the race :

- a] The rider is correct and will not be eliminated
- b] The rider must return to put the pole back up without moving the mugs
- c] The rider is eliminated and cannot correct this
- d] The rider must move the mugs back up the arena, put the pole back up and then move the mugs back down the arena again.
